



YEAR 9 'FINISH THIS' COMPOSITION PROJECT WITH THE ENGLISH NATIONAL OPERA

The year 9 GCSE Music class have just finished a project with the English National Opera (ENO) called Finish This... In this project the class were given the start of a new and unfinished operatic piece called 'Blue, Red, Yellow' and they were tasked with choosing a fourth colour and composing the next section of this piece that represents that colour and finishes the original piece. Our school submitted five pieces this year ranging from "Midnight Blue", "Lavender" and "Blood Red".

This year over 14,000 pupils from 200+ different schools took part in the programme from across the country. 30 of the submitted pieces were then chosen to be made into short animations, one of those being a submission from Magdalen! It can be found on the ENO website below:

Meet Laetisia - Supporting Mental Health at Magdalen

Hi, I'm Laetisia, a Youth Mental Health Wellbeing Practitioner and I work with a small charity "B" which is focused on enhancing young people's mental health and wellbeing in Brackley. Our charity embodies the essence of "being well" in Brackley and is run voluntarily by doctors from Brackley Medical Centre. The charity also provides yoga and art psychotherapy for schools in Brackley.

Over the past four years, I've had the privilege of getting to know the incredible students at Magdalen College School. Each individual brings unique experiences and perspectives, and I am continually inspired by their resilience and creativity. In my role I engage with students across all year groups. Whether it's through small group sessions or one-on-one meetings, I cover a wide spectrum of mental wellbeing topics.

Some students want to talk about their anxiety or low mood, friendships, loss of a loved one, things that might feel difficult at home, the list is endless. Maybe you are struggling with big and strong emotions and struggle to know why? Being listened to and understood in a confidential space can help things feel much more manageable.

One of the joys of my work is incorporating creative activities into our sessions. I firmly believe that learning and healing can be both enriching and enjoyable. Through art therapy and yoga, we explore emotions and foster resilience in a safe and supportive environment.

I also deliver presentations on mental wellbeing during Educational Learning Days (ELDs) so you may have already heard one of my presentations. My aim is to spark conversations about mental health and reduce the stigma that often surrounds seeking help. By fostering an open dialogue, I hope to empower students to prioritise their mental wellbeing.

SIXTH FORM SUCCESS IN THE BRITISH BIOLOGY OLYMPIAD

Before half term, 5 of our Year 13 students elected to take part in the British Biology Olympiad; Jonathan B., Megan E., Thomas R., Grace Moore. and Dulcie H.

This requires 2x 45 minute papers designed to test their Biology knowledge and critical thinking skills. Out of the 5 students who entered, 2 achieved a Gold Award and 1 a Silver. Gold award means they were in the top 5% of students who entered the Olympiad, with Silver being in the top 10%. The average number of students who enter across the UK is 13,000. We are so proud all our students who took part!





Y11 BOYS FOOTBALL COUNTY CUP SEMI-FINAL - MR WARD'S COACH REPORT

The Year 11 boys football team played in the semi-final of the County Cup on the final day of last half-term, Thursday 15th February. Motivated to maintain their 10-match unbeaten streak, the boys were determined to win again, arriving at Northampton Academy (NA) to sunshine and blue skies, with hopes high and morale stronger than ever. Theo H. (Captain) lead a very professional-looking warm-up for the outfield players, whilst Rory P. worked goalkeeper Ben C.

The game started at a high tempo, with Magdalen dominating possession. Against the run of play, NA scored with their first chance on target, a very well-taken goal after Magdalen's defence failed to clear their lines. 1-0. The game's momentum shifted and Magdalen found themselves under pressure following NA's early opener. 20 minutes passed with goalkeeper Ben C. making some excellent saves and Oscar H. and Ronnie B. working relentlessly to keep the deficit at 1.

Students from NA had by now come out en masse to support their side, but Magdalen were not deterred. Suddenly, Deja o. gathered the ball superbly, and charged into the opposition's penalty area - foul! - penalty! Kieran L. was the man of the moment as he confidently swept the ball past the NA goalkeeper. 1-1. Magdalen now felt the momentum was back on their side, with Alfie B. causing havoc down the wing. Unfortunately, MCS were unable to capitalise and before long the half-time whistle sounded.

Following a quick and motivational briefing from their coach, Magdalen started the second half confidently, dominating the possession again. It didn't take long before Rory P., Ali F. and Deja O. combined superbly to allow Theo H. to bury the ball into the bottom corner, a brilliant team goal from MCS. 1-2. The excellent attacking play continued with Lawrence M-C. and Charlie S. running tirelessly up and down the left wing, and the omnipresent Dan S S. thwarting any danger from the opposition. As the game neared its end, with NA desperately searching for an equaliser, Joe K. made some excellent challenges to keep the opposition at bay.

Magdalen could almost taste victory when a high and long goal kick from the NA goalkeeper bounced into the MCS penalty box and an onrushing Ben C. clattered the NA striker. Penalty. 2-2.
