## HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR TESTIMONY - 24 NOVEMBER

On Friday the 24th of November, a testimony run by the <u>Holocaust Educational Trust (HET)</u> will be screened in the school chapel.

The testimony is titled 'Why We Speak?', and will be delivered by Lu Lawrence. Fellow Ambassador Alys Tynan and I both had the privilege to her Lu speak at the HET Ambassador's Conference earlier this year.

She spoke candidly about the story of her father, the dearly missed Holocaust Survivor Zigi Shipper, and of her own experiences as the child of a survivor. Her words left a real impression on me, as they explained a too often overlook aspect of the legacy of the Holocaust.

I would strongly encourage taking up the opportunity to hear a passionate speaker discuss a vital topic. Despite the majority of Sixth Form no longer studying history, it is still really important to continue to learn about the Holocaust and other genocides.

So, please consider coming down to the **Chapel on Friday** the 24th of November from 10:00 to 11:30 am.

#### LAYTON AWARDED THE NWS CUP BY BRACKLEY RUFC

Congratulations to Layton who was awarded The NWS cup. This cup is awarded annually in remembrance of Corporal Nicholas Webster-Smith RMP who gave his life in the service of Queen and Country.

Brackley RUFC is proud of its history of BRUFC members serving in His Majesty's Uniformed Services, however, it has direct links to only one name on the town's War Memorial, that of Corporal Nicholas Webster-Smith RMP who was killed whilst on active service in Afghanistan on the 3rd November 2009.

The award is made to the member of the Junior Section of Brackley RUFC who best epitomises the spirit and ethos of rugby in their attitude and demeanour and is reflected in the motto of the Royal Military Police "Exemplo Ducemus" - By our example we lead, which is what Nic did every day in every way.

The NWS cup is awarded at the start of November, and the date was chosen purposefully. The beginning of the month is the anniversary of Nic's death and the recipient of the award in addition to living up to the example of Nic has one further, poignant duty to undertake, to be the wreath bearer for the Brackley RUFC Poppy wreath in the parade prior to the Town's Annual Service of Remembrance.
