


HEAD STUDENTS' WELCOME






NOW FOR SOME HEAD STUDENTS RECOMMENDATIONS:

In October we went to The North Wall, Oxford to see a powerful, political drama about the tragedy of young people in prison. This play is set in a local prison – Woodhill, Milton Keynes and was written this year about three suicides. It is hard-hitting, desperate and tragic; told through verbatim dialogue and movement.
